SUBJECT: O-23-88 Repealing Chapter 9, Article 5, Part 1 ROA 1994, The Joint Air Quality Control Board Ordinance; Abolishing The Current Albuquerque-Bernalillo County Air Quality Control Board; Adopting Chapter 9, Article 5, Part 1 ROA 1994, The Joint Air Quality Control Ordinance; Creating The Albuquerque-Bernalillo County Air Quality Control Board (Lewis) and R-23-176 Establishing A Moratorium For The Albuquerque-Bernalillo County Air Quality Control Board To Act Under Chapter 9, Article 5, Part 1 ROA 1994, The Joint Air Quality Control Board

Ordinance Until February 1, 2024 (Lewis)

Councilor Dan Lewis, District 5, has introduced two bills, O-23-88 and R-23-176 concerning the Albuquerque-Bernalillo County Air Quality Control Board. State law authorizes the local board to enforce clean air regulations. The proposed legislation, if enacted, would interfere with the Board's required duties regarding the City and County complying with all state and federal regulations that ensure Albuquerque has clean, breathable air.

The proposed legislation would halt adoption of regulations by the Board by delaying their implementation, and by giving City Council the authority to void proposed regulations before they are adopted by the joint city-county board. This is a troubling proposition as these bills would subject expert determinations to political pressures, and they have the potential to undermine the board's ability to maintain air quality standards.

More concerning, the County has not been consulted about how this proposed change would affect the County's air or the County's authority, although it would have an impact on both. The result of an inconsistency between county and city legal requirements would likely both render the board subject to lawsuit and result in the state revocation of air quality powers granted to our city all together.

For the foregoing reasons, the Administration concurs with the Bernalillo County Commission's

resolution (enacted on Oct. 24, 2023) respectfully requesting that Council and my administration engage with and consult collaboratively before moving forward with any changes to the Board's authority or procedures.

WHEREAS, the current Albuquerque Bernalillo County Joint Air Quality Control Board 1 was formed on March 17, 1994; 2 WHEREAS, the Albuquerque Bernalillo County Joint Air Quality Control Board 3 represents the interests of 674,393 persons living in Bernalillo County, including 111,000 4 persons living in unincorporated Bernalillo County, and 563,393 persons living in the City of 5 Albuquerque. Village of Los Ranchos de Albuquerque. and the Village of Tijeras: 6 WHEREAS, the Albuquerque Bernalillo County Joint Air Quality Control Board is 7 comprised of four members appointed by the City of Albuquerque and three members appointed 8 by the Bernalillo County Board of Commissioners: WHEREAS, the powers and duties prescribed to the Albuquerque Bernalillo County 10 Joint Air Quality Control Board and associated agency are delegated to the board from New 11 Mexico Air Quality Control Act, NMSA 1978. The proposed ordinance 10 would extend the powers of the Albuquerque City Council over unincorporated areas as it relates 11 to the regulation of air quality, thus usurping the role and authority of the Bernalillo County 12 Commission, the governing body of Bernalillo County; 13 WHEREAS Bernalillo County has a significant interest in the function of the 14 Albuquerque Bernalillo County Joint Air Quality Control Board and associated agencies; 15 WHEREAS the City of Albuquerque and Bernalillo County have recently shown 16 significant progress in partnering on major issues. The City Council and Board of 17 Commissioners have recently committed to partnerships such as the Middle Rio Grande Housing 18 Collaborative and the Joint City-County Planning of Opioid Settlement Funds. Other 19 longstanding partnerships include the Albuquerque Bernalillo County Library System, the 20 Albuquerque Bernalillo County Community School partnership, and others; and 21 WHEREAS, with the significant challenges our region faces, this is the time for more 22 partnership between our state's two largest local government entities. 23
